

The Island Life

It's no surprise that Sanibel and Captiva islands inspire many a writer to capture the island lifestyle. The Island Book Nook conveniently carries several titles pertaining to Southwest Florida's islands. Store owner Joan Simonds recommended several, including The Other Side of the Bridge by the late Ted Levering and Anne Winterbotham. Based on events that took place on Captiva in the late 1940s and early '50s, Levering uses artistic license to encapsulate them all within a year's time. James D. Newton's Uncommon Friends describes the friendship of part-time residents Thomas Edison, Henry Ford, Charles Lindbergh, and other famous folk. A particular favorite of Simonds's is a hardcover edition of Anne Morrow Lindbergh's classic, Gift from the Sea, inspired by a visit to Captiva. Sanibel's Story: Voices and Images from Calusa to Incorporation, by island historian Betty Anholt, makes a lovely coffee table addition and is chock-full of pictures and snippets of Sanibel and Captiva history. In Sanybel Light: An Historical Autobiography, longtime Sanibel resident Charles LeBuff recounts his singular knowledge of the island, the lighthouse, and the national wildlife refuge. And for a humorous look, check out Sanibel Island's Very Own Cartoon Book by Dave and Lee Horton. 2330 Palm Ridge Road, Sanibel, 239/472-6777.

One (or Two) for the Kids

We had a sneaking suspicion that great book gift ideas could be found in places other than bookstores, and Valhalla proved us correct. A charming collection of hardcover children's books based on the ocean and its creatures are sure to please young ones. Illustrated in vibrant colors, they offer a delightful way to learn. Try The Icky Bug Alphabet Book by Jerry Pallotta, Sunny Numbers, A Florida Counting Book by Carol Crane, Hello Ocean by Pam Munoz Ryan, or Sally Goes to the Beach by Stephen Huneck. Kids and kids at heart will enjoy the seaside presentation of the alphabet and numbers. Even famous people get in on the educational
